602.1 (b) An individual who does any of the following will be asked to leave the premises:

- interferes with an employee in the performance of the employee's city duties; or
- obstructs or intimidates patrons; or
- enters non-public areas without authorization

Individuals refusing to leave after such a request will be subject to arrest and prosecution under California Penal Code

602.1 (d) This section shall not apply to any of the following persons:

(1) Any person engaged in lawful labor union activities or (2) any person on the premises who is engaging in activities protected by the California Constitution or the United States Constitution.
