19. Government Affairs Committee Report by Rita Villa (25 min).

Motion A: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council is opposed to "Street Vending" at City parks and recreational facilities. This Motion is in response to the June 16, 2015 Motion by Councilmembers Price and Huizar. This motion is to be submitted as a CIS to CF 13-1493-S2.

Motion B: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council supports Councilmember Paul Koretz's May 16, 2014 motion proposing amendments to the Citywide Baseline Mansionization Ordinance (BMO), including an amendment: (1) adding an urgency clause, (2) decreasing the base floor area ratio and eliminating the bonuses and exemptions and

(3) accelerating the 18 month time-line initially proposed for the adoption of amendments. This motion is to be submitted as a CIS to CF 14-0656.

Motion C: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood is opposed to the unapproved dwelling unit ordinance as it is currently written. Although we agree that affordable housing should be preserved, allowing a 35% Density Bonus and Density Bonus Parking Options if a minimum number of Restricted Affordable Housing units are provided is not acceptable. Currently, there is no effective mechanism for monitoring compliance for the next 55 years to insure that the required number of units are actually being occupied by Very Low, Low or Moderate Income households as those terms are defined by the California Department of Housing and Community Development. Until an effective method for monitoring compliance with the low income provisions for properties that have already been developed using the 35% Density Bonus is established and enforced, no additional development should be allowed which is effectively an expansion of that program. This motion is to be submitted as a CIS.


20. Land Use Committee Report by Lisa Sarkin or Lisa Karadjian (30 min).

Motion A: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council opposes Vesting Tentative Tract [TT-72928] and Mitigated Negative Declaration [ENV-2014-4617-MND] located at 4215 Vineland Avenue/11015 Aqua Vista. The opposition is based upon the following:

- 1. Not enough infrastructure to support this large development;
- 2. Reduced lanes on Vineland Avenue due to the Bicycle Ordinance;
- 3. Preservation of the historical house [11015 Aqua Vista] as a period exemplar;
- 4. Significant reduction of affordable rental units in the area;
- 5. No consideration for the impact to the congestion because the area is impacted by the 101 freeway and canyon roads;
- 6. Increased impact from The Garland Hotel to parking and circulation;
- 7. Use Quimby Fees to relocate the historic house to the corner of Vineland Avenue/Aqua Vista to create a small parklet;
- 8. Require improvements to "little" Vineland Avenue for the widening of 9 feet along 4215 Vineland Avenue.

Motion B: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council supports the plan approval for the Wyler's Holistic Pet Center located at 11939 Ventura Blvd. [ZA-2005-3268(ZV)(PA3)] contingent on the applicant following all permits and regulations of the Los Angeles Municipal Code and the Ventura/Cahuenga Blvd. Corridor Specific Plan by submitting the required proof to the proper City Departments.
