Motion: The Studio City Neighborhood Council strongly supports the extension of the new [Los Angeles Municipal Code \(LAMC\) 85.02 \(Vehicle Dwelling\)](#). The code, effective since January 7, 2017, currently allows fines to be issued to persons dwelling in vehicles on residential streets and within one block of parks, licensed

schools, preschools, and day care facilities between 9p.m and 6 a.m. Without an extension, this code will expire on July 1 and potentially allow sleeping in vehicles anywhere and anytime in Los Angeles.

Motion A: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council supports the motion of council member Koretz dated December 13, 2017, instructing the City Attorney and Chief Legislative Analyst to review the legislative and regulatory opportunities the City may have for mitigating the impacts of all kinds of group homes on surrounding neighborhoods and communities, including a thorough review of such efforts undertaken in other jurisdictions, and to report back to the City Council within 120 days with analysis, options and recommendations.

Motion B:The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council requests that Councilmember Paul Krekorian make a motion to City Council adding to the Los Angeles Municipal Code that Gas Meters not be located within the front setback of all residential and commercial properties within the City or Los Angeles.

Motion C: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council requests that Councilmember Paul Krekorian make a motion to City Council disallowing "for hire" building and landscaping work on the following holidays: New Year's Day, Presidents' Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas.
