MOTION 9A: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council request that the review of "City Tree and Biodiversity Efforts" called for in CF 15-0499-S1 include the following measures:

Adoption of the recommendations made by the <u>Encino Neighborhood</u> <u>Council</u> in their August 22, 2018 motion on the subject. (<u>See Attached Documents</u>)

Additionally, we request that the City add a policy and mechanism whereby all emergency calls to clear downed branches from street trees, due to high wind events, motor vehicle accidents, etc, causes the tree or trees involved to be scheduled for a follow up inspection by qualified personnel, to determine what additional action, such as pruning, wound sealing, disease diagnosis, etc, may be required to preserve and protect them, with said inspection and treatment to occur within 30 days of the original call.

Setting proper standards for green groundskeeping pilot program. To be submitted as a CIS. Re: Council File 18-0131

MOTION 9B: The SCNC recommends that the City of Los Angeles takes steps to ensure that their pilot program to achieve zero emission operations for groundskeeping on all city properties can maintain long term success.

Common pitfalls that come with transitioning municipal grounds crews from gas to manual and/or electric include: poor equipment choices, untrained crew adoption, loss of work production, equipment strain and failure, crew resistance and resentment, program rejection, and loss of money and time. Crew education and training on electric tools is a key factor to success that is often overlooked or under appreciated.

The SCNC recommends a structured process of implementation that involves an evaluation of existing practices and infrastructure requirements, selection of the appropriate equipment and battery band, education and training of operators. Development of a program that meets American Green Zone Alliance (AGZA) standards or higher would provide a mechanism for accountability, ensuring that the pilot avoided such pitfalls and could demonstrate potential for long term sustainability.

"10/5" Board Composition

The Government Affairs Committee held a duly noticed public meeting on November 7, 2018 with a quorum and again on December 5, 2018 before referring to the bylaws committee, a board composition proposal that envisions ten (10) seats for registered voters within the boundaries of a Neighborhood Council and five (5) seats open to a wide variety of other stakeholders and one (1) non-voting youth member.

The Bylaws committee held a duly noticed public meeting with a quorum on December 9 to review and discuss, and here propose the necessary revisions to make the "10/5" board composition idea practicable.

In that process we took public comment and moved as many items as is permissible by the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment to the operating procedures, where the board has more autonomy. The attached draft of our bylaws and operating procedures have also been amended to comport with the basic minimum requirements of the city.

On December 15, 2018 after meeting with a quorum and taking public comment, the Bylaws committee voted unanimously to recommend to the board adoption of the Revised Bylaws and Operating Procedures.


