A researcher with the Los Angeles Alliance for a New Economy (LAANE) addressed the Government Affairs committee seeking the Studio City Neighborhood Council's endorsement of the Fair Workweek LA policy, <u>CF19-0229</u>. After taking public comment, and hearing from the committee, we agreed that "All workers deserve dignity and respect on their jobs." The Los Angeles Fair Workweek policy would only impact businesses with more than 300 workers and will ensure that retail workers:

1) receive two weeks' notice of their schedules,

2) are not forced to work "clopening" shifts or to remain "on-call" for shifts,

3) will not be retaliated against for requesting a change in their shift,

4) will receive additional compensation for last minute changes to their schedules, and
