Both NBC4 and the LA Times have shared key recent coverage on politicians receiving LAPD officer protection at numerous events outside of Los Angeles and even outside of California. While East Valley communities, including Studio City and North Hollywood,

desperately seek additional LAPD patrol in their neighborhoods, we find this out-of-town allocation of officers -- at taxpayers expense -- very disappointing.

Therefore, requesting the same information, the Studio City Neighborhood Council supports the LA Times who filed a lawsuit requesting Mayor Eric Garcetti turn over records detailing the taxpayer expense of his own security detail during his numerous out-of-state travels, after both City Hall and the LAPD refused to release the documents through the California Public Records Act request.
