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

3. Homelessness Committee (Julie Houlihan 30 min extendable by chair)

a. **Motion**: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council **supports**<u>Council</u> <u>File: 22-1545</u>, in which the LA City Council supports Mayor Bass' Declaration of a local emergency with regard to homelessness, *if amended to include these two key performance indicators: a) decrease the number of homeless individuals who are service resistant and b) increase the number of 41.18 designation zones.*

b. Motion: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council opposes <u>Council</u> <u>File: 23-0033</u>. Brought by CD2's Paul Krekorian and CD4's Nithya Raman, the legislation supports Mayor Bass' Declaration of a Local Emergency and establishes a bank account which the Mayor administrates. The motion provides funding of more than \$50 million from various existing accounts dedicated to Homelessness and requires weekly reporting from agencies including Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA), LA Housing Dept., Housing Authority of the City of Los Angeles and the Department of Transportation. Reports include status updates on homeless outreach and engagements, referrals and placements, expenditures, and other metrics and data; updates on the Inside Safe Initiative; and related matters.

This motion is also to be submitted as a separate Community Impact Statement (CIS) to [CF 23-0033].

c. **Motion**: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council **supports** <u>Council</u> <u>File: 22-0928</u>, which requires Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA) to release monthly reports for one year following any place-based intervention in the City involving more than ten unhoused individuals, such as an encampment with 10 or more people. The reports would detail those who were placed in housing, what type of housing, who did not receive housing or returned to the streets.

The Studio City Neighborhood Council respectfully requests more transparency on the number of permanent support housing units and interim housing beds within the SPA 2 (Service Planning Area) boundaries and the occupancy rates of these facilities on an ongoing periodic basis, either monthly or at least quarterly. These reports should be available electronically.

d. Motion: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council opposes <u>Council</u> <u>File: 21-0042-S5</u>, which requires landlords to provide 3 months rent and moving expenses to Tenants when rent is raised more than either 10% or Consumer Price Index + 5% over 12 months, whichever is lesser. This does not apply to small landlords who own a single-family dwelling unit and no more than four additional dwelling units.

This motion is also to be submitted as a separate Community Impact Statement (CIS) to [CF 21-0042-S5].

e. **Motion**: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council **supports** <u>Council</u> <u>File: 23-0104</u>, to establish a Small Housing Provider Assistance Program to provide payment directly to housing providers who incurred debt due to rental arrears during the course of the pandemic, and report on program parameter recommendations. The fund would provide rental debt assistance for the small and local housing providers in this City who otherwise may never recover lost rental income, could resort to selling property to corporations, or may lose property to foreclosures for their own unpaid mortgages.

4. Sustainability Committee (Adele Slaughter/Chip Meehan 20 min extendable by chair)

a. Motion: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) supports <u>Council File 23-0105</u> to revise the scope of work for the Sepulveda Basin Vision Plan so that it reflects the resolution referenced in the motion signed by more than 80 groups to center geomorphic restoration, climate adaptation and community stability for the Sepulveda Basin Vision Plan. We also request that this motion be moved in an expedited fashion through the three city council committees.

b. **Motion**: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) requests Council President Krekorian and Councilmember Raman direct the Department of City Planning to immediately begin the review and update of the Open Space Element of the City's General Plan. <u>SB 1425</u>, signed by

the Governor last year requires completion of the update by January 1, 2026. The City of Los Angeles <u>Open Space Element plan</u> was last written in 1973. An effort to update the Open Space Element was launched in 2017 as <u>OurLA2040</u>, but was abandoned after less than a year. If Los Angeles is to meet the state deadline in a just, inclusive, and transparent manner, efforts to revive the process must begin as soon as possible. We believe it is achievable to meet our housing needs while preserving, enhancing, and expanding an integrated network of open space to support beneficial uses such as recreation, water resources, heat island reduction, habitat and biodiversity, and public health.

c. Motion: The Board Of The Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) supports <u>Council File: 23-0141</u> to direct the Planning Department, in concert with other supporting agencies, to prepare a report with recommendations to streamline the permitting of ground mounted solar installations as currently described in LAMC 12.24.U.7.

d. Motion: The Board Of The Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) supports <u>Council File 15-0499-S2</u> Biodiversity Protection / Urban Forest / Tree Canopy Coverage / Sustainable Built Environment / Tree Placement / Tree Removal / Land Use Environmental Review

It has been over the two and a half years since the August 12, 2020 request for a report back, there has been extensive substantial loss to the Los Angeles' urban tree canopy. The urban canopy is a valuable, appreciating urban infrastructure asset and its degradation is irresponsible and seriously impacts the quality of life in Los Angeles.

The SCNC requests an update on the report back and encourages the immediate enforcement of all existing tree protection ordinances. We also request an accounting of all exceptions granted in the planning process that allowed tree removal in the 2020/2021/2022 window, in an effort to understand the nature of the damage. It is critical to have ongoing pubic accounting of exceptions to tree protection ordinances to allow ready investigation by the community. It is imperative that our community preserve our protected and significant mature trees.

Clearly protected trees are too easily removed under the "protected tree ordinance" leading to significant losses throughout Los Angeles in recent years. Ecosystem services provided by trees are essential for our city, particularly as we confront the impacts of climate change. A strong Ordinance is critical in the conservation and preservation of trees and the wildlife habitat these trees support. We request an update on the process of strengthening and amending this critical ordinance.

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to 1 minute per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

Public comment cannot be required to be submitted in advance of the meeting, only real-time public comment is required. If there are any broadcasting interruptions that prevent the public from observing or hearing the meeting, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned. If members of the public are unable to provide public comment or be heard due to issues within the Neighborhood Council's control, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned.
