

We OPPOSE the following conditions:

Community Benefits requested by the SCNC to be agreed upon by SRM Studio City LLC for the maintenance of the existing river ramp, stairs, landscaping and area under the south side of the Colfax Bridge. Retain the current trees and foliage along the County property area.

c. **Motion**: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) strongly objects to the current scheduling of the Los Angeles City Planning Department Case Number: CPC-2020-1511-VCU-SPR for the Harvard-Westlake River Park Project. The existing timetable severely limits the opportunity for meaningful review and engagement by the SCNC and concerned stakeholders. The final EIR is set to be released on May 24th, granting the SCNC and interested parties only 8 business days before the hearing officer reviews the case. Following this, the CPC hearing is slated for June 22. This expedited timeline is inadequate for proper evaluation and input. As the largest land use project in Studio City's recent history, the Harvard-Westlake River Park Project has sparked significant stakeholder involvement and numerous neighborhood council meetings. The condensed schedule from the date the EIR is released to the two hearings prevents meaningful participation from the SCNC and our stakeholders. Considering the project's complexity, the voluminous DEIR, and the considerable public comment submitted to the SCNC and to City Planning, it is unclear why such an unmanageable timeline has been established. Due to the inability to thoroughly review and engage with the project, the SCNC is compelled to oppose it. We urge Councilmember Raman to employ all available resources, including presenting an expedited motion at the LA City Council, to require LA City Planning to reassess their scheduling decisions. We ask for a revised hearing calendar that allows for comprehensive public participation. Lastly, we urge the applicant Harvard Westlake to agree to waive any legislative time requirements where applicable, to allow the community time to meaningfully participate. Original hearing notice. a.**Motion**: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) requests Councilmembers Nithya Raman (CD4) and Paul Kerkorian (CD2) work with Energy and Environment Committee Chair Katy Yaroslavsky and other knowledgeable parties to develop a multi-pronged approach to

address the lack of enforcement related to the banning of gas-powered leaf blowers (Ordinances 171400, 171890, and 172086). The City of LA urgently needs to develop a system that 1) tracks greenhouse gas emissions from leaf blowers, especially since these emissions remain uncounted in other governmental tracking systems, 2) focuses on enforcement against homeowners, 3) develops incentives for the purchase of electric leaf blowers (e.g., DWP Cash for Grass program), and 4) focuses on public relations and educational campaigns, which could include Neighborhood Councils as key partners.

b. **Motion**: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) supports Council File 22-1469: LA City Biodiversity Index / California Native Landscaping. California is one of six biodiversity "hot zones" and yet, currently, there is a dearth of native habitat, open space and drought tolerant vegetation in the San Fernando Valley as a result of overdevelopment. Native landscaping does not require as much water, saves energy, supports wildlife, and increases biodiversity. Promoting the planting of Natives may be the easiest change we can make with respect to sustainability.

 - a. **Motion**: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) opposes Council File 14-1371-S13 to amend the Los Angeles Living Wage Ordinance (LWO) and the Los Angeles Hotel Worker Minimum Wage Ordinance (LA HWMO) to increase the minimum wage in one dollar increments starting at \$25 per hour in 2023 and ending with \$30 per hour in 2028. Unfortunately, inflation is a vicious cycle driven by rising prices and rising wages in a which came first scenario... the chicken or the egg. Business profit and employee profit gains are mostly canceled out in the end.

- c. **Motion**: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) requests Council President Paul Krekorian and Councilmember Nithya Raman introduce a Motion to rename the Los Angeles City nickname of "City of Angels" to "City of Weeds" due to the proliferation of weeds growing out of every last nook and cranny everywhere you look.  - a. **Motion:** The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) opposes Council File 21-1230-S2 because it aims to by-pass public input by making the Liveable Communities Initiative by-right or administrative, overriding community plans, specific plans and overlays with building allowed in high fire hazard areas, historic districts and open space. - b. **Motion**: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) requests Councilmember Nithya Raman and the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (L.A.D.O.T.) to mitigate the ignored "Stop Sign" at the northeast corner of Kling Street and Goodland Avenue.
- 14. Public Safety Committee (Jeff Hartwick 30 min extendable by chair)
 - a. **Motion**: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) supports <u>Council File 23-0002-S44</u>: Title, AB 74 (Muratsuchi) / Illegal

Street Takeovers / Sideshows / Racing /Enforcement Tools / Fatalities Prevention. Illegal street takeovers and car racing have been a persistent nuisance and dangerous problem throughout Los Angeles. Promoted through social media, street takeover spectators gather at city intersections, roadways, and bridges and proceed to block traffic and engage in dangerous stunts. Incidents of looting, vandalism, and public use of alcohol and illicit drugs are commonplace. Postings of these activities on social media appear to encourage more of this aberrant behavior. AB 74 would make street takeovers a standalone crime, expand the ability of law enforcement to impound participants' vehicles, and impose restrictions on offenders' driving privileges. We urge our councilmembers to support this important bill so that takeovers, property damage, noise, and fatalities on our streets are reduced. This motion is also to be submitted as a Community Impact Statement (CIS) to Council File 23-0002-S44.

b. Motion: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) supports Council File 23-0002-S36: Title, SB 44 (Umberg) / Fentanyl Manufacturing and Distribution / Potential of Criminal Liability / Written Notice Requirement. Fentanyl is a potent synthetic opioid and a Schedule II controlled substance that has wreaked deadly havoc across the country. It is responsible for the majority of drug-related deaths during 2021 and the leading cause of death for persons 18 to 45, surpassing Covid-19 and suicide. An astonishing 74,000 died of fentanyl overdoses between July 2021 and June 2022. More needs to been done to stop this epidemic of death. SB 44 would require a written notice be provided to those convicted or who have plead guilty to the manufacture or distribution of fentanyl on the potential criminal liability resulting from any deaths related to the offense. Also known as Alexandra's Law, it is modeled after the California's existing DUI advisory. This law would help law enforcement and prosecutors establish implied malice in cases of drug-induced death resulting from fentanyl sold or furnished by a previously convicted-drug dealer or trafficker. More dealers and traffickers would be put behind bars. We urge our councilmembers to support this bill.

c. Motion: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) opposes Council File 23-0002-S37: Title, SB 50 (Bradford) / Peace Officer / Traffic Stop/ Low Level Violation / Prohibition. Existing law authorizes a peace officer to make an arrest pursuant to a warrant or without a warrant if, among other circumstances, the officer has probable cause to believe that the person has committed a public offense in the officer's presence. SB 50 would prohibit a peace officer from stopping or detaining the operator of a motor vehicle or bicycle for a low-level infraction, unless a separate, independent basis for a stop exists. Thus, violations involving vehicle registrations, license plate positioning, vehicle lights, window tints, or bicycle equipment could not be pursued by peace officers unless a separate independent basis was also found. An officer would only be able to send a citation or warning letter to an offender. This misguided approach, in the name of social justice, would encourage people to openly flout the law and further chaos on our streets. What use are laws if they aren't being enforced by authorities? At a time when California prosecutors are failing to prosecute many low-level crimes, more enforcement of our traffic and safety laws is needed, not less, in order to make our roads safer.

Studio City Neighborhood Council Committee Meeting Agendas are posted for public review on the SCNC website at studiocitync.org and at the Radford Studio Center gate on Colfax Avenue, as well as, at the gate on Radford Avenue.

All Stakeholders are required to park in (or walk into) the studios' Sater parking structure at 4200 Radford Avenue. There are a limited number of accessible parking spaces in front of the meeting room and while there is no direct path of travel to the meeting room via a sidewalk, the studio and SCNC want to assure that Stakeholders with disabilities are able to access the meeting without difficulty. Stakeholders with disabilities who have a valid DMV placard, use a wheelchair, walker or cane, and/or those who have difficulties walking distances should contact Radford Studio Center Security Office at 818-655-5085 to request shuttle assistance at least 24 hours prior to the meeting in order for the studio to arrange services for the meeting.

Public comment is limited to 1 minute per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board (or Committee Chair). Public comment cannot be required to be submitted in advance of the meeting, only real-time public comment is required.

Radford Studio Center Audience Shows and Events Policies

To attend an audience, show, event, or public meeting at Radford Studio Center, the following items are required:

- Valid Government issued Driver's license if you are driving a vehicle onto the lot.
- Valid Government issued Identification card if you are walking onto the lot. A Military ID and Passport ID will suffice.
- An adult must accompany minors (17 years old and younger). Student ID cards are preferred for those who have them.

The following items are prohibited on your person while attending an audience show, event, or public meeting on Radford Studio Center property:

- Knives
- Mace/pepper Spray
- Sharp Objects
- Firearms
- Alcoholic beverages
- Drugs (including marijuana for medicinal purposes)

All guests are subject to security screening and search. Guests will be required to pass through a metal detector or screened using a hand-held metal detector.

- Once the audience member has emptied their pockets and turned over any prohibited items, the audience member will be instructed to proceed through the metal detector or screened using a hand-held metal detector.
- Should the audience member activate the metal detector, the person will be asked to step to the side and will be scanned (entire body length front and backside) by the Security Officer with the hand-held metal detector.
- The audience member will not be allowed into the Studio until the Security Officer is satisfied that the individual has nothing on his/her person that constitutes a danger to others.
- Should the guest refuse to be screened, they are subject to being denied access to Radford Studio Center property.
- NO FIREARMS OF ANY KIND ARE ALLOWED INSIDE THE STUDIO. Security Officers who
 detect that a guest is in possession of a firearm should notify the Security Supervisor and P.O.
 IMMEDIATELY.
- Off-duty Law Enforcement in possession of a firearm will be instructed to either return the weapon to their vehicle or turn it over to Security where it will be kept, UNLOADED, in a SAFE, located in the security manager's office.
- Any props or toys that resemble weapons in any way are to be denied or confiscated. This includes props / accompanying costumes.

Each guest/audience member will be required to submit a form of identification which will be tagged with an item that is confiscated and held with security. Guests and audience members will be instructed to pick up their confiscated items at the first (1st) level of the Sater parking structure near the elevators at the completion of the event. No personal pets are allowed at any time on the Studio lot.

If, at any time, an audience member or guest, wanders away from their event or meeting space, into an unauthorized area, that person is subject to immediate dismissal from the lot.
