- Call to Order & Roll Call (1 min)
 - a. VP Jerry Lewis called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Roll was called by Secretary Burkhart. 13 members were present or on Zoom at roll call. Qurum was met. Vice President Lewis read the announcements to the attendees and the Board.
 - i. <u>Announcement only:</u> A reminder to those attending, during public comment you may hear colorful language that some might find offensive. The SCNC has no ability to control or regulate the content of speech that is protected under the 1st Amendment.
 - ii. <u>Announcement only:</u> Please remember we are guests of Radford Studios. It is important that we remain courteous and respectful to all Radford staff we may encounter during our time on the lot. We need to respect and comply with all regulations on the lot.
 - iii. Announcement only: Please remember that your permission to enter the private property here, is limited to access to the rooms in which we hold our meetings and any rest rooms or support facilities that exist. You are not cleared to wander the lot indiscriminately. Please do not go to areas of the facility where you have no reason to visit under your SCNC access.
 - iv. <u>Announcement only</u>: Please remember that the presentations and questions from stakeholders are not an opportunity to engage in a two-way conversation.

- 2. Call for Special Items (1 min)
 - a. Board Member Hartwick asked to remove Transportation Motion A for further discussion. Please note that this motion was later pulled by the committee chair Barry Johnson, so no further action/discussion occurred.
- 3. Public Comments on <u>non-agenda</u> items within the Board's jurisdiction, and public comment on the consent calendar (15 min, extendable by chair)
 - a. Stakeholder Pamela gave a summary of homeless encampments and fires.
 - b. Stakeholder Scott Mandell via Zoom spoke about several topics:

Consent Calendar contents and their inclusion of topics such as the current agenda Govt Affairs Motion A. Feels it should be sent back to committee. Believes the motion should be revised

Motion B Goats for brush clearing–feels that Sustainability should be more involved

Transportation Motion A agreed with it being pulled

Lastly, Stakeholder shared his opinion on general voting habits of public officials and their impact to our neighborhood

- c. Stakeholder Barry Johnson spoke about parkingless apartment buildings and their impact to our community. They are not appeal-able and would require a lawsuit to stop.
- d. Stakeholder Bob Pastirjak spoke about high-density development and it's impact on Studio City.
- e. Stakeholder Lior Gamliel also spoke about high-density development and it's impact on Studio City in support of the stakeholder above.
- f. Stakeholder Kevin Bai, Public Engagement Manager from Serverobotics informed us that their delivery bots would be in our area.
- 4. Announcements by Government Representatives (15 min, extendable by chair)
 - a. David Nguyen, Mayor's Office absent, no report.
 - b. Congressman Sherman addressed the Board and Stakeholders with a brief update regarding his efforts at the federal level. Congressman Sherman discussed his success in obtaining funding for local projects such as the Studio City Recreation Center. He also spoke about the need for re-districting. His deputy, Sean Reagan distributed certificates to the Board members. The Congressman also presented our VP Jerry Lewis with an American flag that had flown over the Congress building.
 - c. Supervisor Horvath's office field representative Katie Abrams spoke to the group about:

Providing updates on the new county Homeless Services department meetings in the coming months.

Gathering additional information about the Hollywood Bowl shuttle area renovation timeline.

Sending details about the coordinated efforts between CD2, CD4, and transit agencies regarding the LA River jurisdiction.

Working with Sydney on coordinating efforts between CD2, CD4, and transit authorities for LA River jurisdiction issues.

- d. Councilwoman Nithya Raman CD 4, Field Deputy Sydney Liss, sidney.liss@lacity.org reported about upcoming events and Councilmember Raman's desire to continue working with the State Senate on finding compromises for SB 79 that would work better for Los Angeles. Sydney also discussed their work with the Chamber of Commerce regarding improved signage for the parking structure during the farmers market. CD-4 will coordinate with LADOT and Studio City Business Improvement District on better signage for the underused city parking lot between Whitsit and Laurel Canyon.
- e. Assembly Member Shultze, Victory Ray discussed legislative successes including the expansion of film tax credits and concerns about SB 79's impact on housing development in the San Fernando Valley. He discussed the difficulty of jurisdiction between various gov't agencies regarding homeless individuals cutting of fences. The meeting with CALTRANS executive director will be held on Nov 12in Valley Village.

Government Affairs Committee - Barry Johnson

Motion A: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) opposes Council File 25-0247 to instruct the Department of Building and Safety (LADBS), in consultation with the Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD) and the Department of City Planning (DCP), and with requested input from Livable Cities Initiative (LCI) and the American Institute of Architects Los Angeles (AIA LA), to present within 90 days modifications to the City's Building Code in order to allow for single-exit, single-stairway, multifamily unit residential buildings up to six stories. This Council File seeks to extract yet more entitlements for those already benefiting from subsidized Density Bonus housing, by dramatically reducing accepted, common sense national public safety protections for all residents of multi-family structures. The gratuitous proposed removal of double stairwell egress for emergency evacuation in such projects would delight real estate developers and investors as they look towards the eventual deregulation of rent suppressed units and windfall revenue increases when the enlarged units are restored to full market value.

This motion is also to be submitted as a Community Impact Statement (CIS) to Council File 25-0247.

Transportation Committee - Barry Johnson

Motion A: Having previously submitted Motions on January 19, 2022 and September 25, 2024, the Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) further clarifies its support of the Sepulveda Transit Corridor Project (a high-capacity rail line connecting the San Fernando Valley to the Westside) with the following requests from the SCNC to the Draft Environment Impact Report (DEIR) request for comments:

- All Subway (ONLY under Van Nuys Boulevard, the Santa Monica Mountains and Westwood Boulevard).
- Single-bore tunnel because it has a huge air plenum at the top of the tunnel, so thousand foot (or more) vents are not needed.
- Use modern automated driverless technology with the ability to get down to 90 seconds between trains and a
 capacity of 16,000 pphpd with the ability to peak at up to about 20-22,000 pphpd.
- ONLY Walk-through cars (These are important for security because a single security person can access any
 car on the train while it is moving).
- Platform screen doors at all stations so passengers can't fall on the track.

and enter 898 684 8286 and then press # to join the meeting. When prompted by the presiding officer, to provide public input at the Neighborhood Council meeting the public will be requested to dial *9 or use the Raise Hand option, to address the Committee on any agenda item before the Committee takes an action on an item. Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered. Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Committee's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Committee is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to 2 minutes per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board. SB 411 Updates: In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. (C) The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. (D) Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate. (E) (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed. (ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment. (iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.

Radford Studio Center Audience Shows & Events Policies

To attend an audience, show, event, or public meeting at Radford Studio Center, the following items are required:

- Valid Government issued Driver's license if you are driving a vehicle onto the lot.
- Valid Government issued Identification card if you are walking onto the lot. A Military ID and Passport ID will suffice.
- An adult must accompany minors (17 years old and younger). Student ID cards are preferred for those who have them.

The following items are prohibited on your person while attending an audience show, event, or public meeting on Radford Studio Center property:

- Knives
- Mace/pepper Spray
- Sharp Objects
- Firearms
- Alcoholic beverages
- Drugs (including marijuana for medicinal purposes)

All guests are subject to security screening and search. Guests will be required to pass through a metal detector or screened using a hand-held metal detector.

- Once the audience member has emptied their pockets and turned over any prohibited items, the audience member will be instructed to proceed through the metal detector or screened using a hand-held metal detector.
- Should the audience member activate the metal detector, the person will be asked to step to the side and will be scanned (entire body length front and backside) by the Security Officer with the hand-held metal detector.
- The audience member will not be allowed into the Studio until the Security Officer is satisfied that the individual has nothing on his/her person that constitutes a danger to others.
- Should the guest refuse to be screened, they are subject to being denied access to Radford Studio Center property.
- NO FIREARMS OF ANY KIND ARE ALLOWED INSIDE THE STUDIO. Security Officers who
 detect that a guest is in possession of a firearm should notify the Security Supervisor and P.O.
 IMMEDIATELY.
- Off-duty Law Enforcement in possession of a firearm will be instructed to either return the weapon to their vehicle or turn it over to Security where it will be kept, UNLOADED, in a SAFE, located in the security manager's office.
- Any props or toys that resemble weapons in any way are to be denied or confiscated. This includes props / accompanying costumes.

Each guest/audience member will be required to submit a form of identification which will be tagged with an item that is confiscated and held with security. Guests and audience members will be instructed to pick up their confiscated items at the first (1st) level of the Sater parking structure near the elevators at the completion of the event. No personal pets are allowed at any time on the Studio lot.

If, at any time, an audience member or guest, wanders away from their event or meeting space, into an unauthorized area, that person is subject to immediate dismissal from the lot.
